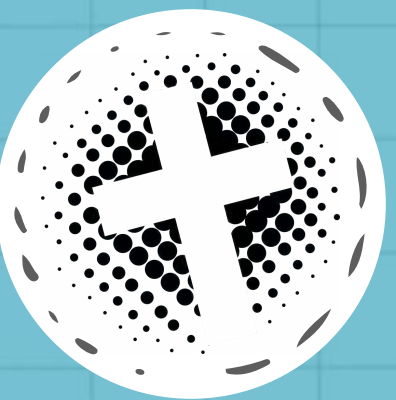
**We are meant to enter into life changing

- 1. Shachah** – The primary Hebrew word, meaning to “bow down” or “worship”
- 2. Halal** – Hebrew word for crazy exuberant praise
- 3. Shabach** – Hebrew word for loud praise
- 4. Taqa** – Hebrew word for clap or applause
- 5. Kara** – Hebrew word for dance
- 6. Tehillah** – Hebrew word for song of praise
- 7. Tephillah** – Hebrew word for intercession
- 8. Barak** – Hebrew word for kneeling before God in humble submission
- 9. Yadah** – Hebrew word for extending the hands in thanksgiving and praise
- 10. Towdah** – Hebrew word for a thanks offering
- 11. Zamar** – Hebrew word for making music accompanied by strings
- 12. Proskuneo** – The primary Greek word, meaning “to kiss”



1. SHACHAH - MAY BE TRANSLATED AS
"TO BOW" OR "WORSHIP"
DEPENDING ON THE CONTEXT.



2. HALLAL is a primary Hebrew root word for crazy exuberant praise. Our word "hallelujah" comes from this base word, "praise (halla) to jah (God)." It means "to be clear, to praise, to shine, to boast, show, to rave, celebrate extravagantly, to be clamorously foolish, express joy, jubilation and celebration."

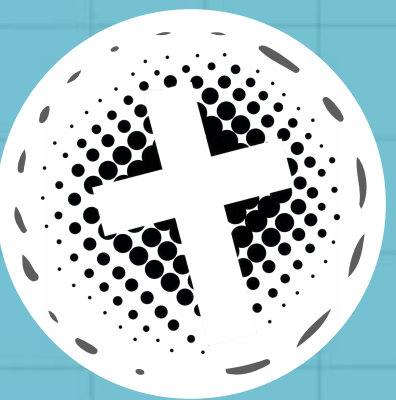




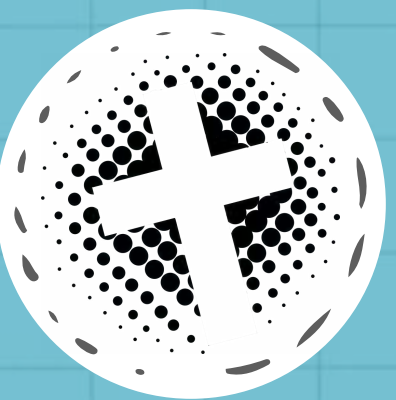
3. SHABACH MEANS, "TO SHOUT,
ADDRESS IN A LOUD TONE, COMMAND,
TRIVMPH, SHOUT PRAISE, OR EXPRESS
CONFIDENCE IN GOD'S ABILITY."



4. TAQA TO CLAP, APPLAUD.
EXPRESSES JOY AND VICTORY.



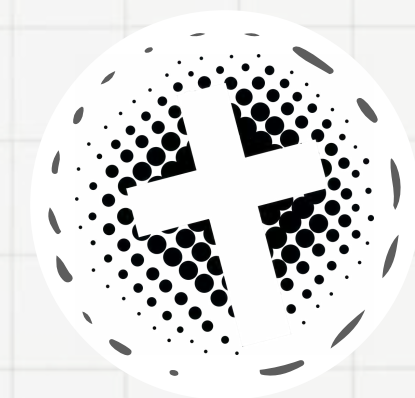
5. KARAR WHICH MEANS TO DANCE
OR TO WHIRL. EXPRESSES JOY
AND CELEBRATION.



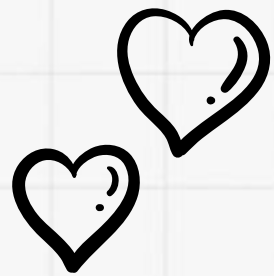
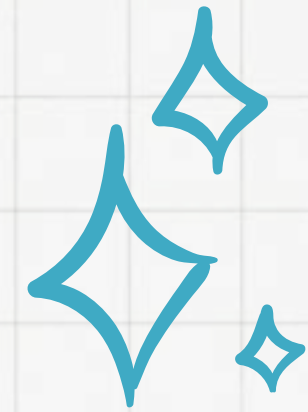
6. TEHILLAH is derived from the word halal and means “the singing of halals,” to sing or to laud; perceived to involve music, especially singing; hymns of the Spirit or praise. To sing a spontaneous, unrehearsed song to the Lord, from your Spirit. Another translation can be singing scripture to instruct and encourage.

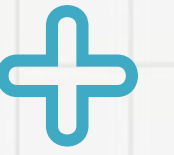


7. TEPHILLAH MEANING A PRAYER, OFTEN
SUNG AS INTERCESSION AND PETITION.
DIGGING OR BEGGING. ANOTHER TRANSLATION
CONVEYS A DEEPER MEANING, "A LABOR OF
AWAKENING THE HIDDEN LOVE WITHIN THE
HEART UNTIL A STATE OF INTIMATE UNION
+ WITH THE DIVINE IS ACHIEVED."



8. BARACH MEANS "TO KNEEL
DOWN, BLESS GOD AS AN ACT OF
ADORATION, SALUTE, KNEEL, BLESS
THE LORD. EXPRESSES HUMILITY."



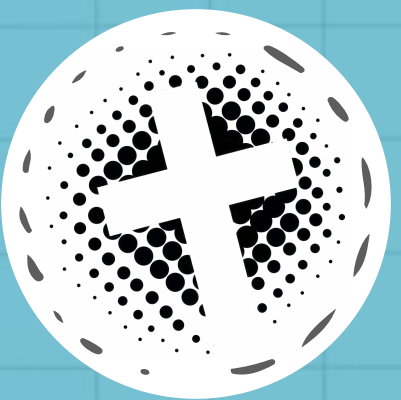


9. YADAH IS A VERB WITH A ROOT MEANING, "THE EXTENDED HAND, TO THROW OUT THE HAND, THEREFORE TO WORSHIP WITH EXTENDED HAND, TO LIFT THE HANDS. EXPRESSES GRATITUDE, THANKFULNESS AND SURRENDER."





"SACRIFICE OF PRAISE"



10. TOWDAH comes from the same principle root word as yadah, but is used more specifically. Towdah literally means, thanksgiving or an extension of the hand in adoration, declaration, or acceptance. By way of application, it is apparent in the Psalms and elsewhere that it is used for thanking God for “things not yet received” as well as things already at hand.





11. ZAMAR is “to make music by striking the fingers on strings or parts of a musical instrument. Also to pluck the strings of an instrument, to sing, to praise; a musical word which is largely involved with joyful expressions of music with musical instruments.”



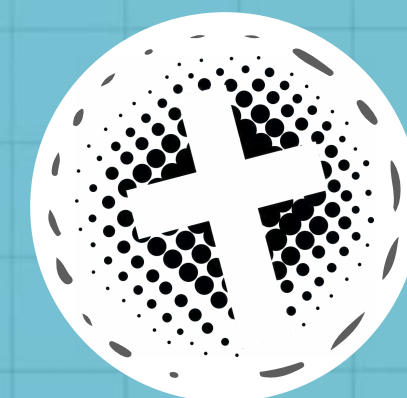


12. PROSKUNEO means to show reverence to; or another translation can be “to kiss” as in to kiss the hand of a superior. It is commonly associated with bowing down or lying prostrate on the ground with the idea of kissing the ground before someone. The idea is to show profound reverence and submission to someone.
